#### FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN



The August Feed My Starving Children packing involved 6 Lions and 3 community members. On that day ACLC helped pack 101 boxes which made 21,816 meals, feeding 60 children for a year. The value of the packing was \$5,235.84. The July FMSC packing event had 4 Lions, 3 community members, and 2 grandchildren participating. The results were 105 boxes packed; 22,680 meals created, & 62 children would be fed for a year. The value was \$5,443. In 11 Feed My Starving Children packing dates from Ag. 2021-June 2022, over 327 children



#### **Illinois Historical Parks**



BISHOP HILL is a State Historic Park located in western Illinois (Henry County) which is run by the Illinois Dept. of Natural Resource. Bishop Hill was formed in 1846 from Swedish settlers led by Eric Janson. The group of over 1500 strived to create an operating communal system under a religious background. The name BISHOP HILL came from Janson's Swedish home area of BISKOPSKULLA. The group built a church, dormitories, large barn, school, bakery, brewery, buildings to make rugs, brooms & buggies, a flour mill, and a sawmill. BISHOP HILL was a mecca for Swedish immigrants who later moved into Minnesota and North Dakota The Commune fell apart in 1861 after the

death of Janson. The State of Illinois took over the property and worked to rebuild some of the original buildings. The Swedish Royal Family also contributed. Today if one goes to BISHOP HILL, you will see the colony church (1848), the boy's dorm (1850), the colony barn (1850), and the colony hotel (1852-1861). Swedish style restaurants and shops are also open for visitors (304 Bishop Hill Rd, Bishop Hill) (309-927-3345).

Over 17 Lions Clubs are found along I-94 near Bishop Hill These include Kewanee Evening, Galva, Orion, Sheffield, Altoona, Alpha-Woodhull, Coal Valley, & Prophetstown.
