Having reached the Diamond Sales Award (10 million copies) with their HIGH FIDELITY album, the Band is also recognized for such hits as "Keep on Loving You," Take It On the Run," "Can't Fight this Feeling," & "Keep the Fire Burning." The Band still performs and was seen in an episode of the Netfllix series OZARK. Lions Clubs are found in Champaign, Urbana and Savoy (District 1M).

CHEAP TRICK was a band out of ANSWER FOUND IN NEWSLETTER. Formed in 1973, the Band had hits with "Surrender," "I Want You to Want Me," "Day Tripper," "Dream Police," & "Ain't That a Shame." The Band was inducted into the Cleveland Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 2016. The Band still performs having sold over 20 million albums.
